Rural/Urban exhibition

Ms Higgins said in the meeting that Manish Khan is very pleased with the attendance rates at his groundbreaking exhibition. Still, to ensure we do not suffer any financial losses from the exhibition, she suggested distributing flyers in suitable locations to boost visitor numbers even further. The committee agreed. It was also agreed that Harley should be in charge of the design of the flyer.

Mr Hung reported that Dr Tsui has settled on the theme for her talk at the exhibition. Specifically, she will be focusing on the elusive beauty of the modern city. Dr Tsui has also graciously offered to give the speech on two occasions rather than just once. After a brief discussion, the committee agreed that the best day for the second talk would be the previous Friday, at the same time.

Student assistants

Ms Tan informed the committee that there has been increased interest in the part-time student assistant positions following the announcement that we will soon be opening our museum cinema in Exhibition Hall 5 on 28 December. 

Section 5.4: Part-time Student Assistant Staff

5.4.1 Main duties

Part-time assistants are permitted to do the following:

- hang up photographs for exhibitions
- assist visitors
- conduct guided tours

5.4.2 Working hours

Assistants must not work more than two days a month (Saturdays and Sundays only).

Assistants shall work no more than five hours per day.
