Fashion victims

You might think that a fleece-lined jacket, a raincoat or two pairs of waterproof boots were part of a person's wardrobe. You would probably be surprised, however, to learn that these items can actually be part of your pet's wardrobe.

This trend in pet clothing has outraged some people. 'How would you feel if you were a poodle forced to wear an uncomfortable vest with a matching hat? Pets have rights too, you know!' exclaimed one concerned pet lover. Pets, surely, have never felt the need to



wear designer clothing or to have any part of their fur braided or styled. In the past, a good scratch or lounging around in the sun seemed to suffice. Yet, it appears that human vanity has spread to the pet kingdom.

A number of vets have also voiced their concerns. 'It's quite unnatural for pets to have a warm outer layer on top of their fur and it can cause them [...] discomfort, especially during the summer. Not only that,' adds veterinary surgeon Dr Peter Wong, 'but it can cause irritable skin disorders, overheating and dehydration, and can attract fleas, mites and other biting pests.'

Advocates for pet clothing, on the other hand, argue that pampering their pets is a way of showing love. 'And what about your pets' right to not wear these types of accessories?' enquires our reporter. 'Their right? Well, my little Fifi looks just great and never complains,' says one advocate. The critics are not impressed, arguing that owners should treat their pets like pets and not stuffed toys.
